



Online Lecture Series**

The School of Allied Health Sciences of DPSRU organized the Series of four (4) numbers of Online Guest Lectures by various domain experts with diverse horizons during 13th April to 18th May 2020. The sessions were attended by faculties, research scholars and students of various courses. An Online session on implementation and evaluation of Public Health on April 13th 2020 by Prof. Koustuv Dalal, Prof. In Public Health Science and Senior Health Economist, Mid Sweden, Sweden University, Sweden. Prof. Dalal has wide and long experience of developing and administering various Programmes of Masters in Public Health in world's top Universities like Karolinska Institute Sweden shared his knowledge and experiences in the field of public health. Prof. Dalal also emphasised on community based research, implementation and evaluation of public health projects and also guided students about the career prospects.

On 1st May 2020 an online session was delivered by Mr. Venkatesh Krishnamoorthy, Country Manager for BSA: The Software Alliance in India, on the topic "Artificial Intelligence for Arogya", where different dimensions of Artificial Intelligence were addressed.
