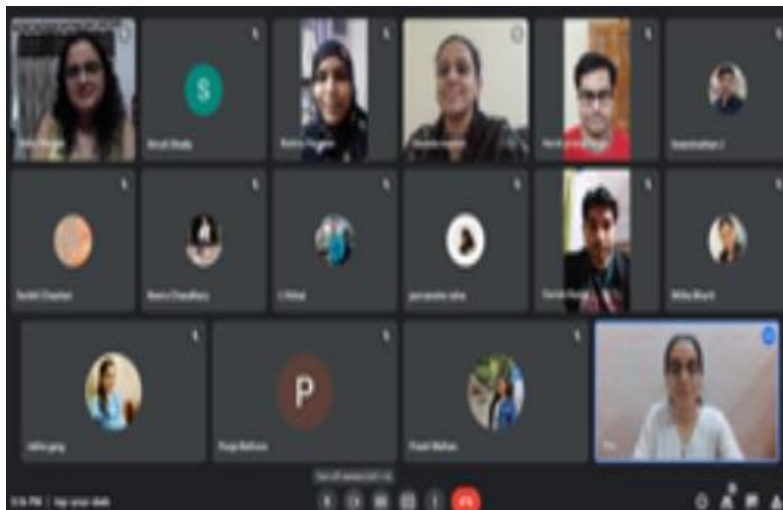


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Report on Measurements in Epidemiology

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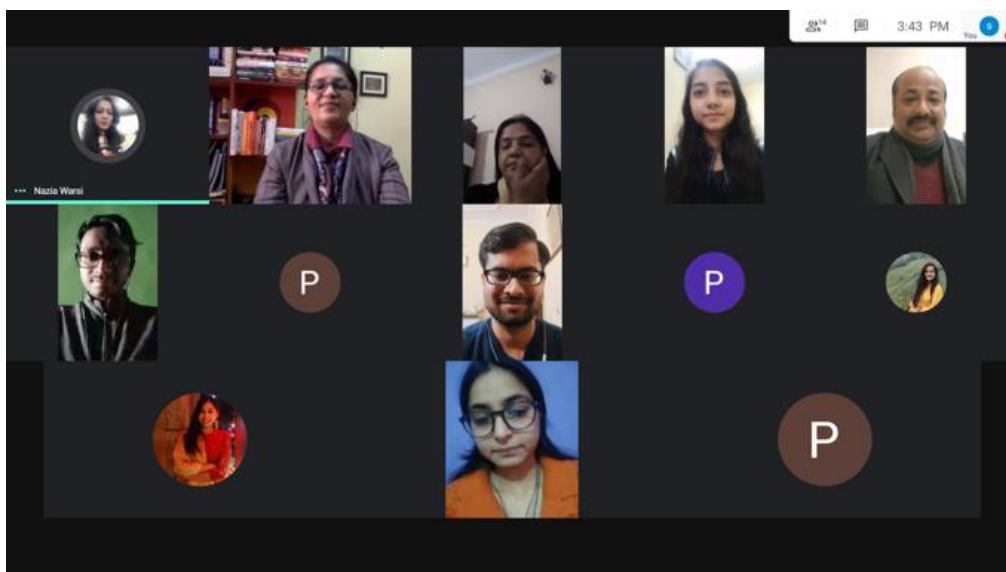
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Parallel Sessions Department wise

Pharmaceutical Management

Ms Reena introduced the concept of Brand marketing and strategy adopted by top brands to the students. It was an impactful learning experience to the students who opted for MBA in Pharmaceutical Management. The session was attended by faculty of Pharmaceutical Management Dr. Jaseela Majeed, Dr Abhishek Dadhich and. Ms. Rakhi Ahuja.



Hospital Management

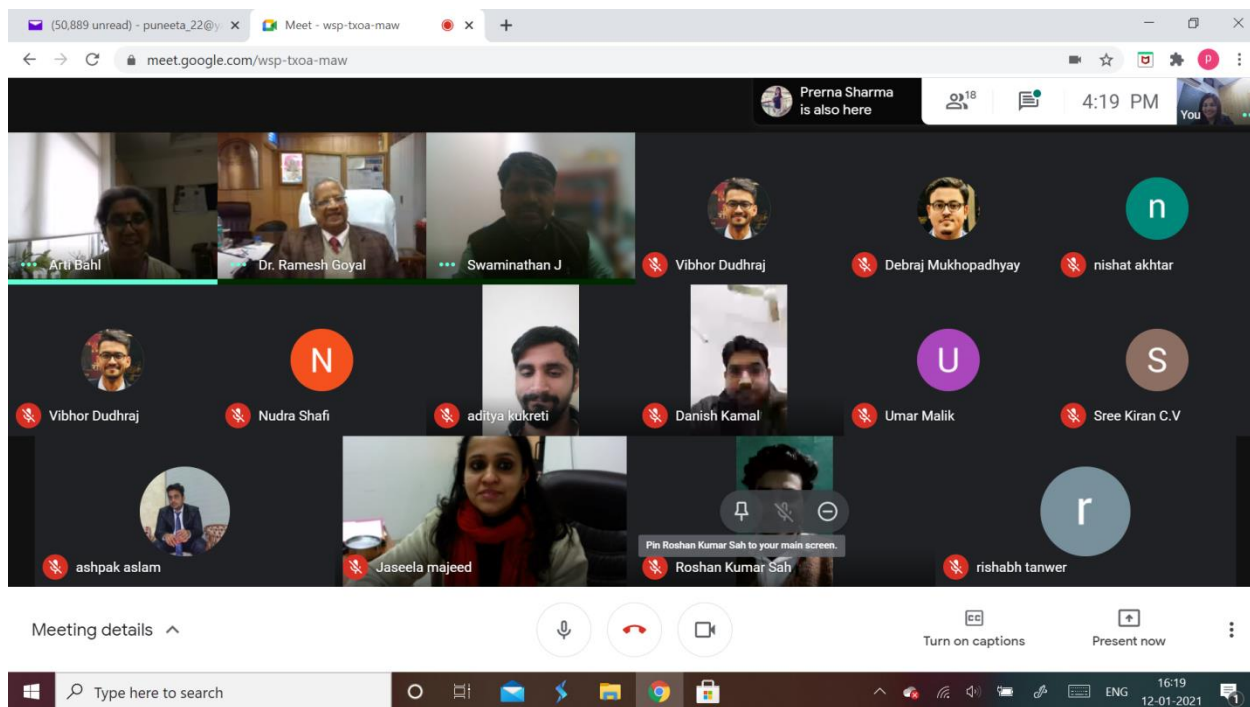
In the afternoon session from 2.00 -3.00 pm, a lecture on “**Overview of Hospital Management in India**” was delivered by **Dr Ashok Agarwal**, Former Director, School of Allied Health Sciences, IGNOU and Adjunct Professor, IIHMR Delhi. It was attended by all the students of new and existing batch of MHM. Dr Sheetal Yadav opened the session by introducing and welcoming the key note speaker.

During the lecture, Dr Agarwal gave an overview about the problems and issues in the field of hospital management. He raised his concern about the little mention of hospitals in our National Health Policy, Huge CAPEX and OPEX and undefined roles of managers. He mentioned the inequality in healthcare distribution, shortage of hospitals and hospital administrators in the country and poor quality of care. He also highlighted that how material & equipment planning and management can help in containing the costs. Following the lecture, the students interacted with the keynote speaker. The session concluded with the vote of thanks by Dr Jaseela Majeed, Head, School of Allied Health Sciences.

Public Health

Dr Arti Bahl, Joint Director, Epidemiology Division, National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), New Delhi was keynote speaker in the department-wise parallel session and delivered a lecture on “**Challenges in Public Health: Role of NCDC**” from 3.30 to 4.30 PM for the students of Master in Public Health Program. The session was opened by introductory remarks from Honorable Vice Chancellor followed by welcome address by Dr. Jaseela Majeed, Head, School of Allied Health Sciences. Dr Bahl provided an overview of MPH program and discussed about the existing challenges in Public health. She also highlighted the role played by NCDC in overcoming these challenges. She mentioned that NCDC works in coordination with State Governments and has the capacity and capability for disease surveillance, outbreak investigation, and rapid response to contain and combat outbreaks. She also stated that COVID-19 pandemic has impacted every aspect of our healthcare system, but at the same time Governments along with healthcare workers are taking all appropriate measures to overcome them.

Following the lecture, possibilities of collaboration between NCDC and DPSRU were discussed. Hon’ble Vice Chancellor sir suggested that short duration “Caption Courses” should be initiated to strengthen public health system of the country after which students interacted with the speaker. The session concluded with vote of thanks by Dr. Puneeta Ajmera.



DAY-2

The second day of the Induction programme, new students got the opportunity to interact with **Dr. Suresh Kumar**, Director, Institute of Palliative Medicine, Kerala, a WHO Collaborating

Center for Community Participation in Palliative Care. Dr Suresh was the first to conceptualise and implement a community-based and volunteer-driven palliative care as against institution-based care. Over 15,000 trained volunteers support the Institute of Palliative Medicine which care the terminally ill patients. He talked about offering palliative care not only to cancer patients, but to others suffering from debilitating illnesses as well. During the session he motivated students and stressed on creating compassion among healthcare professionals which is the need of the hour.

The afternoon session of Day-2 began with Importance of Yoga in life by **Acharya C.P. Ray**, Yoga Instructor, Yoga and Fitness Center, DPSRU. Acharya CP Ray began the practical session on yoga to relieve our body and mind from stress. Then he talked about various yoga asans and how yoga has played a vital role in everybody's life during this pandemic.

This was followed by an interactive session of seniors and juniors wherein juniors were welcomed by seniors. It was an Ice beaking session wherein new students opened up during the interaction with seniors. The session was radically needed to introduce the fresher's to the new environment and syllabus on the whole.
